Holmes County, Fla.—The Florida Department of Health in Holmes County (DOH-Holmes) is informing residents of two confirmed horse cases of locally-acquired Eastern equine encephalitis. DOH-Holmes and Holmes County Mosquito Control are coordinating surveillance and prevention efforts.

DOH-Holmes reminds the community to avoid being bitten by mosquitoes by taking these basic precautions.
