This diagram depicts the relationship and hierarchy of state-level emergency response planning documents.

This structure combines incident specific plans and functional procedures with an all-hazard base plan to serve as a flexible and adaptable plan network for any incident.

**Base Plan:** 

Public health and medical appendix to the State Comprehensive Emergency Management Plans.

Establish the core public health and medical missions during preparedness, response, recovery, and mitigation in Florida.

Public Health and Medical Emergency Operations Plan for the Department of Health

Describes hoe the Florida Department of Health will respond to incidents facing Florida's health and medical system.

The base plans are applicable to all department employees.

**Hazard Response Strategies** 

Define the overreaching direction for public health and medical response to a specific hazard. Establishes leadership's intent, goals, and objectives.

Strategic - Target Audience: Executive Leadership

**Incident Playbooks** 

Script out specific actions that must be taken by the incident management team to implement leadership's strategy. Playbooks include incident objectives, essential elements of information, advanced planning considerations, and public messages.

**Operational - Target Audience: Emergency Coordination Officer and Incident Managers** 

**Functional Procedures (Standard Operating Procedures)** 

Describe all-hazards standard, detailed actions required to carry out a specific functional aspect of a public health and medical mission during response. Procedures are supported with tools, checklists, Templates, and forms necessary to implement procedures.

Tactical - Target Audience: Individual Responders and Incident Management Team Members
