School Health Services Program Data Summaries School Year 2022-2023

The School Health Services Program Data Summaries are a collection of data sources that reflect the core data points used to assess the functioning of the School Health Services Program across Florida. The State Health Office, School Health Services Program has overseen the data stewardship and publication of the summaries since the 2013-2014 school year.

To ensure consistency and document changes over time, this cover page serves as a repository for modifications made to the data set during the current publication. Changes are driven by factors such as data quality improvement, policy updates, and reporting requirements.

The following updates and changes were implemented for the 2022-2023 Data Summaries:

- School sites (elementary, middle, high, and combined level schools) for each county are based on the official count of public schools reported by the Department of Education (DOE).
- The school health expenditures under “County Health Department (CHD) - state, federal, local, and other funds”, pertaining specifically to the expenditures of “state” and “federal” funds portion, are now derived from the state-level reports provided by the Office of Budget and Revenue Management.
- The definitions for student health conditions have been refined. These updated parameters have been disseminated to local offices, ensuring a standardized and enhanced approach to the data gathering processes.

These changes will be the standard for future reports unless otherwise noted on this cover page.
