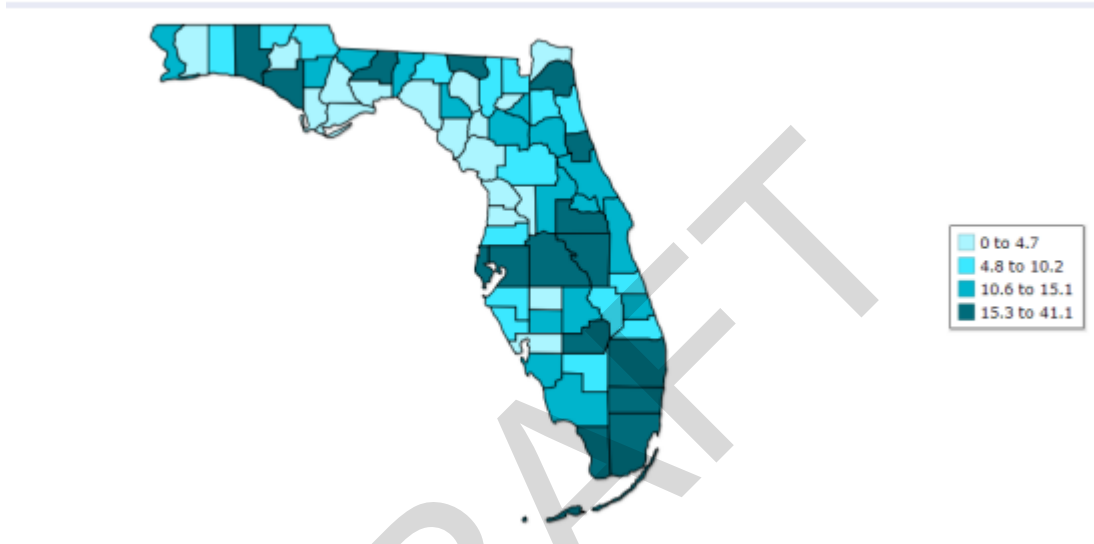

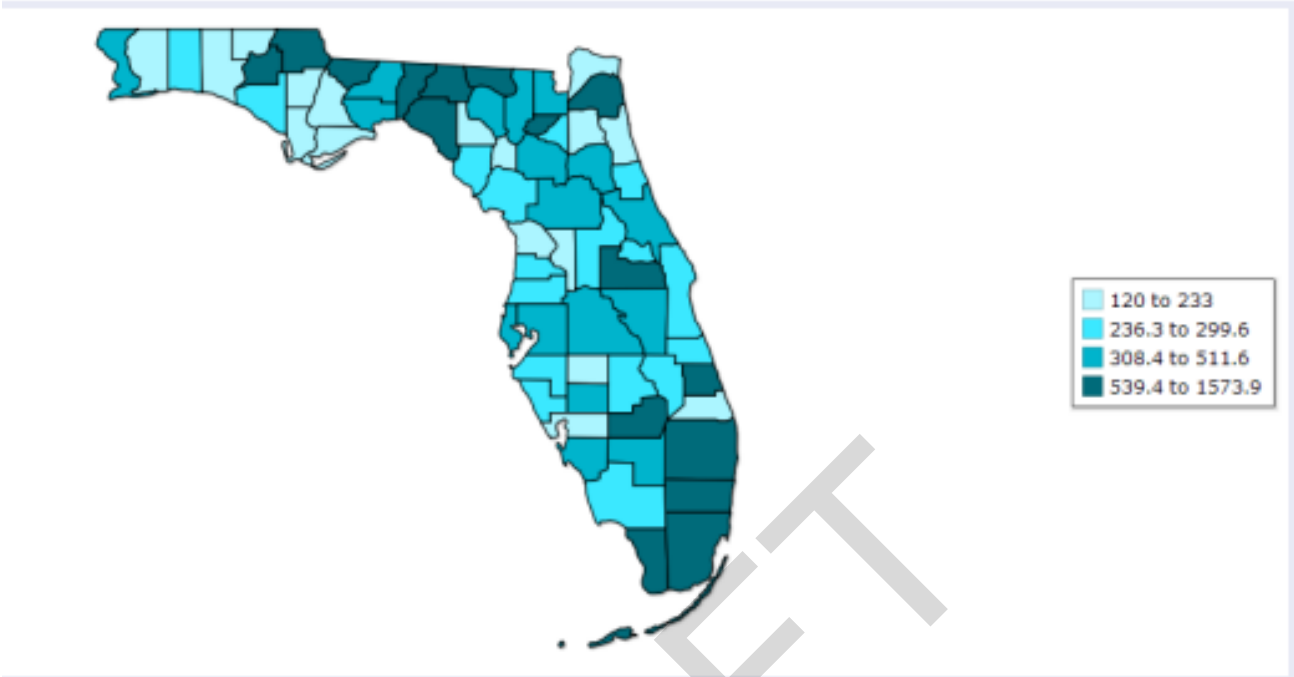
Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) Diagnoses, Rate Per 100,000 Population, 2019

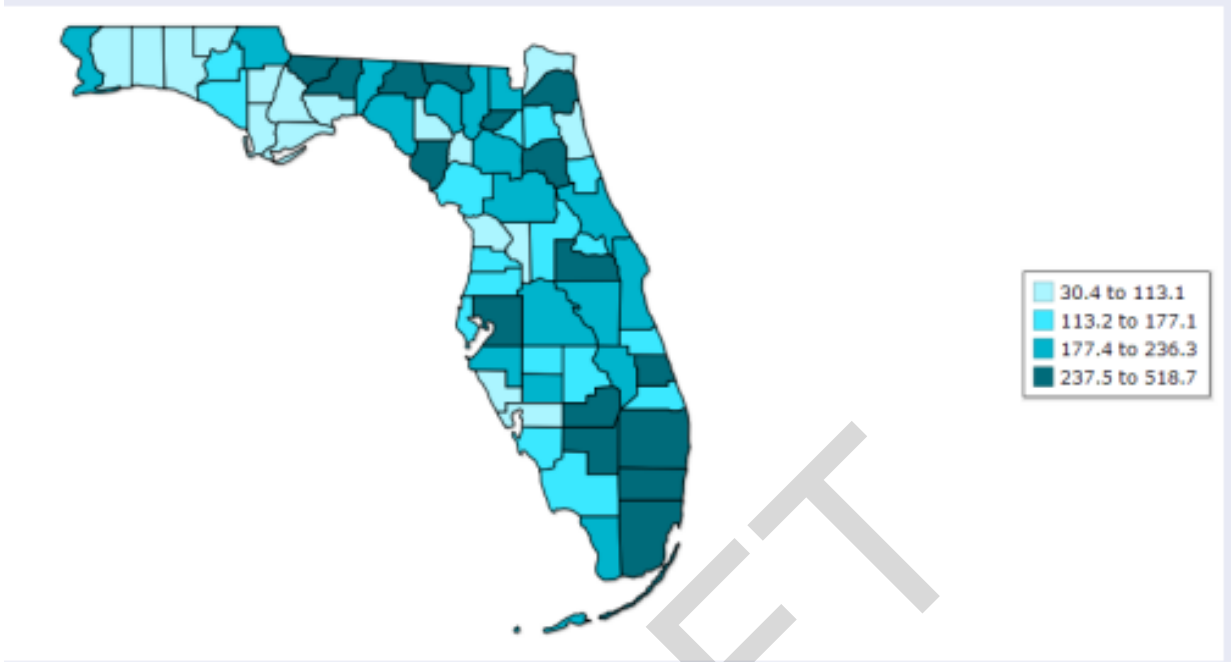

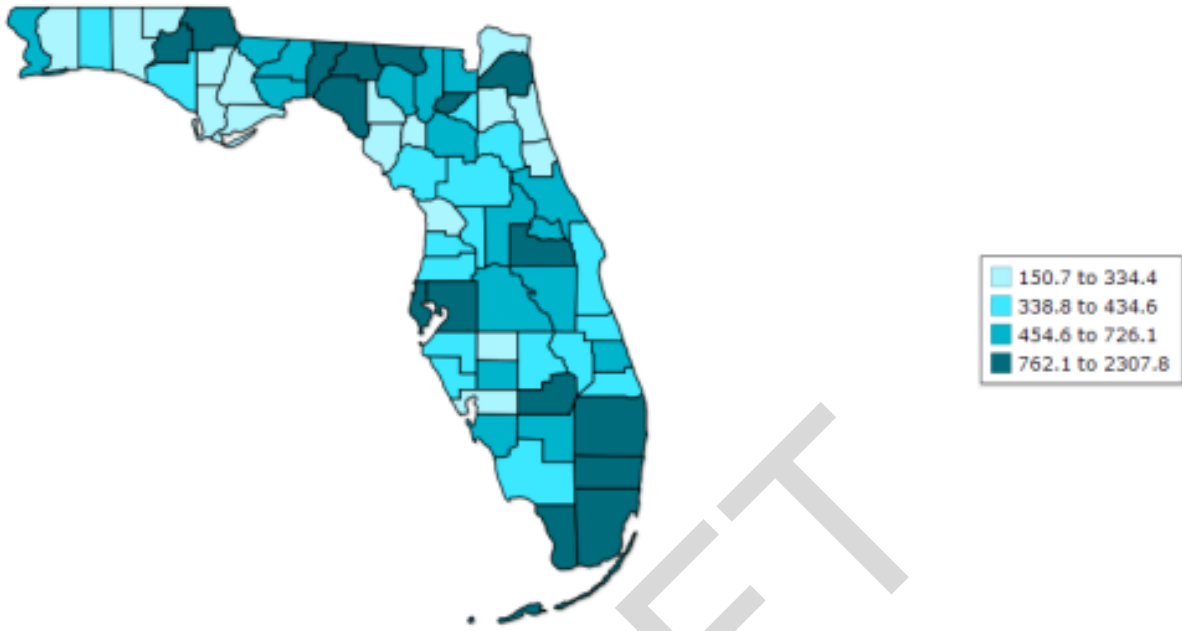

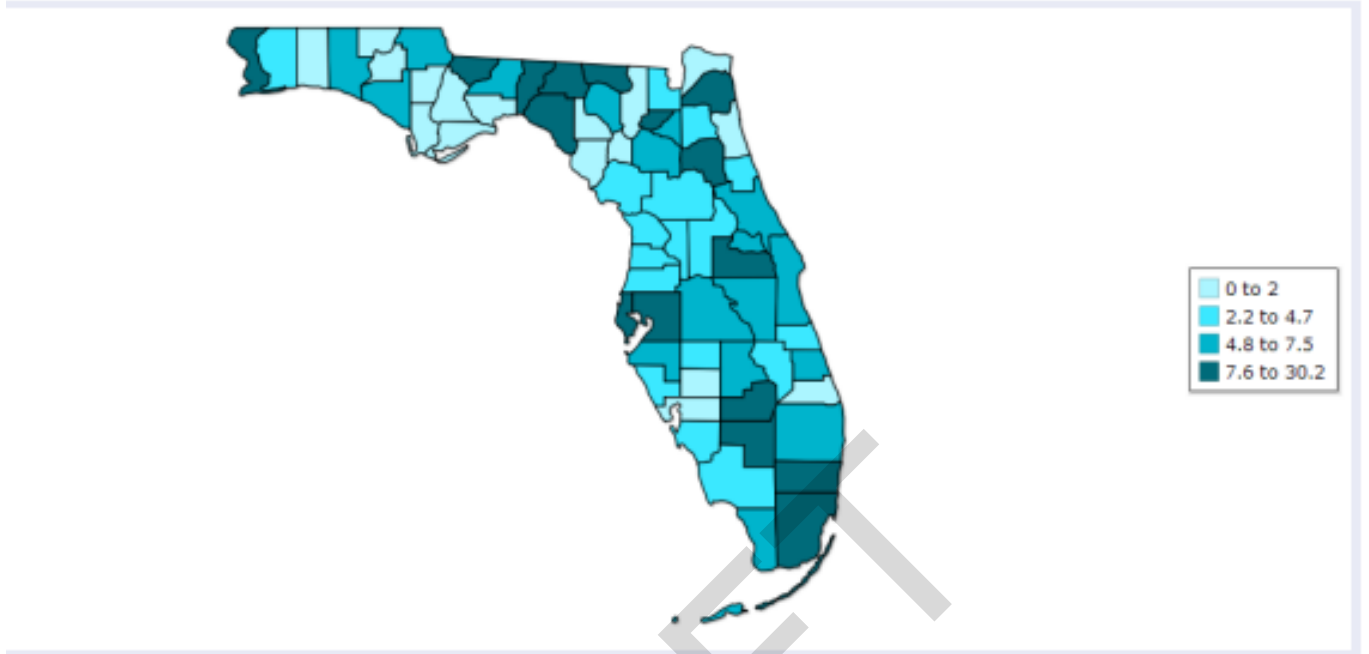
