This skills-focused day will leave participants with many "tricks of the trade", feeling more confident with the airway anatomy, providing care and recognizing patients who may or may <u>not</u> be candidates for various procedures. Cases will be practiced in real time with the team making critical decisions relating to appropriate procedure, equipment and meds.

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
