That's my understanding.

I'm kind of hoping I got that.


All right, however, what has come out of it is because trauma has standards.

And there's that one little section in there that talks about B.


Skip does designation.

That's where in talking with legal and this is gone back and forth many times with legal, legal came to the decision that we could designate trauma centers specifically under the trauma standards because it is mentioned there in the trauma standards.
